The VDHA accepts PayPal payments for New Memberships, Membership Renewals, Merchandise payments, etc., as well as checks and money orders.

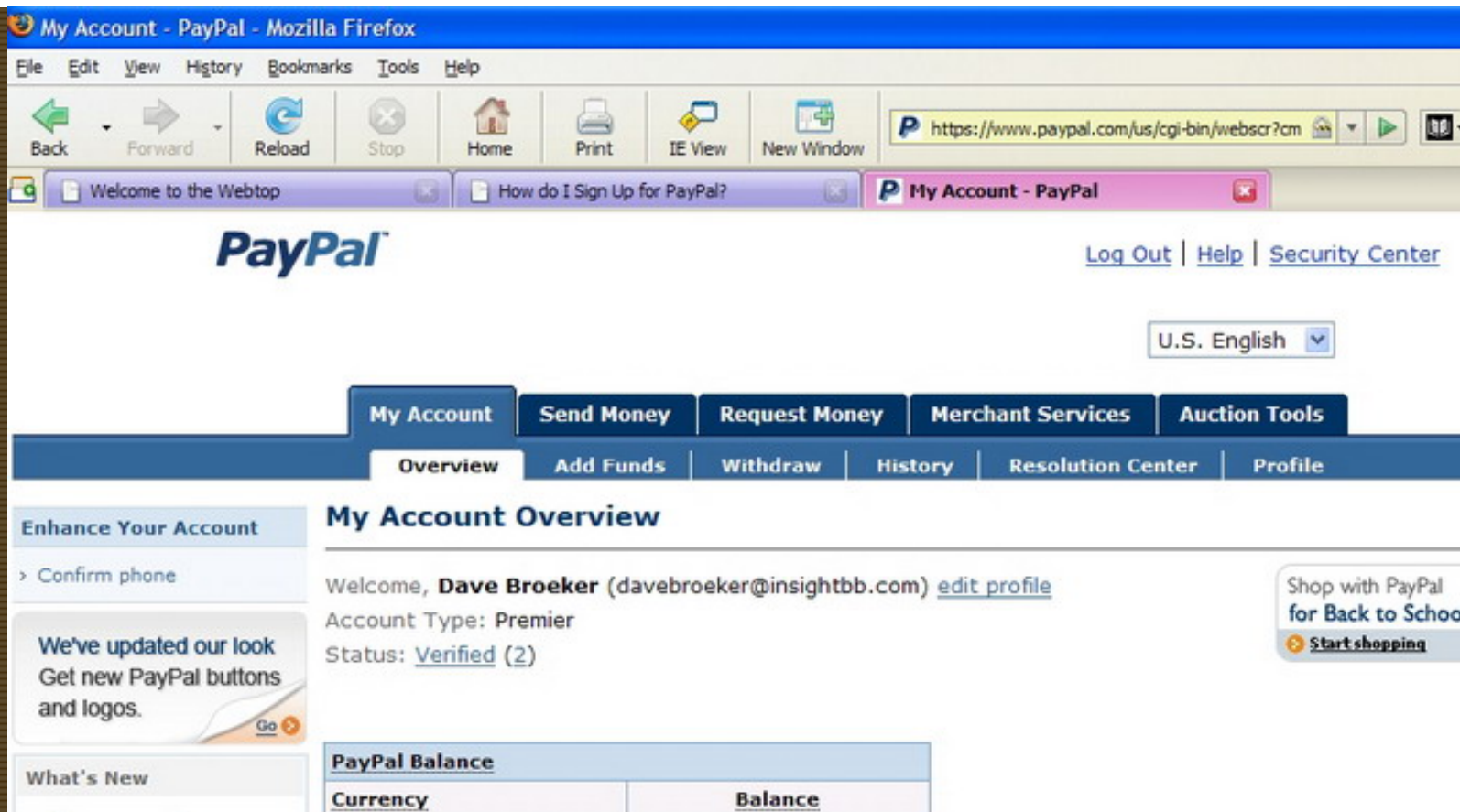
Prior to using PayPal for items on our website, *you must have*
already registered with PayPal
and created an account with them

. Once this has

been completed, you can use the PayPal website to make payments to the VDHA website.

The VDHA will do everything they possibly can to make this transaction very simple. Please follow these simple rules:

1. VDHA Web pages that offer payments via PayPal will be clearly marked with the PayPal Secure Logo.
2. You will always be offered information to make sure you go to the [Official PayPal website](#).
3. The VDHA e-mail address to make your PayPal payments to is vdhapaypal@vdha.us .
4. Always, Always _____, make sure that the PayPal address you go to, starts with HTTPS:// . The "S" is for "Secure" and that guarantees that your financial transaction will be encrypted at 128 bits and is safe to process over the Internet.



5. The amount you will owe for Membership dues or renewals, as well as merchandise purchases, will be confirmed by a VDHA Officer at the time of your purchase.

6. When planning to use PayPal, follow the simple instructions on each page and select "PayPal" payment, then select the "continue" button. This should take you to a confirmation page on your order and give you a link to PayPal, so you can make your payment at that time.

7. When your PayPal payment is confirmed received by the VDHA Treasurer, your order will be processed, whether it

be for merchandise or membership dues.
